Brief Description	Part A: Annotated Timeline- Students will analyse three historical sources (using TOMCA=PRU elements) to represent Austalia's WWII experience in the format of an annotated timeline. Part B: Justification- Students will select one of the key events and write a JUSTIFICATION (Extended TEEEC) of why this event was significant to Australia's history; and utilise historical sources and evidence to substantiate their argument.	Research: Students will conduct research to locate and select relevant historical evidence relevant to the rights of freedoms for either Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders or African- Americans (student choice) Essay: Students will draft and refine a sustained essay, integrating historical evidence, to evaluate how activism by key individuals and groups have changed rights and freedoms in Australia or USA	Research Report & Tool Annotations: Students will research ONE biome of their own choice and create a research report, integrating geography tools to identify the main threats to the biome, impacts and environmental management strategies. Students will select, analyse and annotate 2x or more geography tools within the report. Bibliography: Students will document their research in an academic bibliography.	Part A: Fieldwork Investigation- Students will attend a Fieldwork excursion (Week 3) and investigate a case study of local environmental change and management. Part B: Management Strategy Proposal- Students will select one management strategy as the most effective solution to the fieldwork investigation and write a proposal arguing its merits. NOTE: Students who do not attend the Fieldwork excursion, will study an alternate fieldwork investigation at school	Yearly Exam: Students will sit a combined HSIE exam, assessing key skills; and knowledge and understanding for both Geography and History.
